ABOUT THE MUSIC

Originally composed for my public school string ensemble students, *Motion* can work as a stand-alone beginning string orchestra/quintet piece or as a warm-up for an intermediate string orchestra. As a rhythmic study, Motion gives students the opportunity to practice rhythmic stability and off-beat syncopation accuracy. Syncopation is at the foundation of music from many different cultures. Students have the opportunity to become familiar with diverse styles of music.

A fine introduction to Jazz bowing, the notated articulations allow students to practice and feel how jazz musicians articulate eighth notes. Imitating the sound of the drum teaches a new rhythmic study for string instruments with a bow.

Motion is written in a sequential and additive style that allows students to strengthen their fingers, develop accurate intonation in first position and practice concentration skills. Students learn about the form of a music composition through the use of repeats and first and second endings. Ensemble is also developed with the addition of rests so students can practice counting and entering in tempo.

Students should learn Motion at a slow tempo with the tempo increasing gradually. Teachers can introduce different be wings through this study as well. For more advanced Jazz studies, this easily inemorable piece can be played by ear in other keys.

ABOUT THE COMPOSER

Six time Grammy Award winner Akua Dixon has been at the forefront of improvising string players since 1973 and is "one of New York's leading jazz musicians!" NY Times. A multi laureate of the National Endowment for the Arts, she is considered "amongst the treasures of contemporary Jazz". After graduating from New York's famed High School of Performing Arts, she studied cello with Benar Heifetz at the Manhattan School of Music.

Her original compositions and arrangements for strings have been performed globally. She has worked on Broadway and concertized with the likes of Duke Ellington, Max Roach, Aretha Franklin and others.

The leader of Quartette Indigo, "Jazz's leading string quartet", "they prove that strings can swing". This ensemble performs Akua's original compositions and unique arrangements of Jazz, Spirituals, Blues, Salsa, Tango, Rags and Bebop.

Her latest album, AKUA'S DANCE, full of "excitement, style and harmonic swing" was one of the top Jazz albums of 2017. Akua won the Downbeat Critics Poll in 2018, positioning the cello as a viable instrument in Jazz. Her current project, We The People examines Life, Liberty and Justice for all through a harrowing harmonic journey.
